On-site recreational facilities include volleyball and basketball courts, environmental trail, outdoor swimming pool and The Rohr Challenge Center. Off-site activities include mountain biking, canoeing and fishing. Only ¼ mile from the camp is a bus stop for the Allegheny County Port Authority where you can take a bus to any other Pittsburgh attraction, including the Pittsburgh Zoo, Riverfront Trail, Carnegie Science Center and Museums, Heinz History Center, National Aviary, PNC Park and Heinz Field.

Camp Guyasuta is owned and operated by the Boy Scouts of America. The camp dates back to 1918 when it was donated by Mrs. Darlington, the great granddaughter of General O'Hara. Annually, 20,000 scouts, schools groups and non-profit organizations from the Southwestern Pennsylvania region use the camp. This beautiful property consists of 175 acres located in O'Hara Township and Sharpsburg and has close ties with Aspinwall Boro.

The Facilities at Camp Guyasuta



We have five buildings, six program shelters, campfire arena, newly renovated swimming pool and spray ground, basketball and volleyball courts, and a ½ mile handicap accessible nature trail complete with signs about history, flora, fauna and geology. The stream that runs through the camp is called Guyasuta Run. The water is very pure and home to some endangered salamanders and invertebrates. There are several waterfalls which display Ames limestone rock structures. When hiking through the camp, you will get the experience of being in the wilderness while being only a few miles from downtown Pittsburgh.

Camp Guyasuta is excited to offer our McGinnis Education Center to corporations for their next meeting or retreat. In addition to our conference center, we offer Corporate Team Building Programs that make use of a variety of educational tools, group initiative games, low ropes course elements, high course elements and a climbing/rappelling tower.
