On-site recreational facilities include volleyball and basketball courts, environmental trail, outdoor swimming pool and The Rohr Challenge Center. Off-site activities include mountain biking, canoeing and fishing. Only ¼ mile from the camp is a bus stop for the Allegheny County Port Authority where you can take a bus to any other Pittsburgh attraction, including the Pittsburgh Zoo, Riverfront Trail, Carnegie Science Center and Museums, Heinz History Center, National Aviary, PNC Park and Heinz Field.

Welcome!

Camp Guyasuta is owned and operated by the Boy Scouts of America. The camp dates back to 1918 when it was donated by Mrs. Darlington, the great granddaughter of General O'Hara. Annually, 20,000 scouts, schools groups and non-profit organizations from the Southwestern Pennsylvania region use the camp. This beautiful property consists of 175 acres located in O'Hara Township and Sharpsburg and has close ties with Aspinwall Boro.

The Facilities at Camp Guyasuta



We have five buildings, six program shelters, campfire arena, newly renovated swimming pool and spray ground, basketball and volleyball courts, and a ½ mile handicap accessible nature trail complete with signs about history, flora, fauna and geology. The stream that runs through the camp is called Guyasuta Run. The water is very pure and home to some endangered salamanders and invertebrates. There are several waterfalls which display Ames limestone rock structures.

When hiking through the camp, you will get the experience of being in the wilderness while being only a few miles from downtown Pittsburgh.

Swimming Pool, Canoes, Bicycles and More!



Our swimming pool is open to the public and used by many organizations and agencies. We also provide a Canoe & Cycle Program. Participants canoe from Sharpsburg to Millvale or PNC Park then mountain bike back to Camp Guyasuta along the River Trail. We also host fishing and sightseeing trips aboard our 22' Pontoon Boat docked along the Allegheny River.

Project COPE at the Rohr Challenge Center



Our Rohr Challenge Center teaches both youth and adults team work, conflict resolution, problem solving, leadership, self esteem building, trust and learning about each other. Our Challenge Course has been used by agencies for teams to learn to work together. Our High Ropes Course has a 50' climbing and rappelling tower, which is also handicap accessible. We have had over 4000 participants on our course last year; many who were "at-risk youth" who learned to face challenges in a healthy, positive way.
